An Impact that Endures

The John Jay Whites came to Litchfield from New York City in 1863 and built Whitehall, a building that a century later would become the Center's Nature Museum. Two of their children, Alain and his sister, May, loved the woods and farmlands so much that they made Whitehall their permanent home.

Ardent conservationists and visionaries, Alain and May wanted to preserve the countryside for future generations to enjoy. In 1908 the Whites began purchasing land throughout northwestern Connecticut: abandoned farms, scenic spots, waterfalls, mountains, and forested valleys. Over time they acquired approximately 10,000 acres. The State of Connecticut Park and Forest system benefited greatly from the Whites with the donation of about 6,000 acres. Kent Falls, Macedonia Brook and Mohawk State Parks, as well as other sites, were donated by the Whites.

In 1913, Alain and May decided to form a non-profit trust in the memory of their parents and the White Memorial Foundation was incorporated. In 1964, the White Memorial Conservation Center was formed as the education branch of the Foundation, and Whitehall, the former home of the Whites, became what is now the Center's Nature Museum.

White Memorial, today, comprises 4,000 acres of fields, waters, and woodlands, 35 miles of trails, a museum and campgrounds, all in the towns of Litchfield and Morris. Tens of thousands of visitors each year benefit from this legacy of Alain and May White.
